BRAVE BELLA

Ultimately a trip to the ER resulted in them finding out that Bella was completely blind in her right eye, and she had tumors.

Their fight would lead them to St. Jude's Children's Research Hospital. Her treatment included a total eye enucleation (eye removal). Bella was not a candidate for chemo or radiation due to the number of tumors that were in her eye. The removal of her eye saved her life. She is cancer free today!

Bella is all of the good in the world we hope our children will be. Since her diagnosis, she has created **Brave Bella Bead Co.**, a braceletmaking business. She takes orders and hand beads each bracelet. And she donates proceeds to St. Jude's Research Hospital. You can find out more on her Facebook page (use the QR code below).

Sella is a smart, bright, beautiful 11year-old girl from Louisiana who is on a mission to raise as much awareness and funds as she can for her type of cancer, retinoblastoma.

Bella was diagnosed in February 2015 at just two and a half years old. By happenstance her mom, Robin, read an article about a child in Australia who had been diagnosed by her mother. They noticed that every picture taken of the child with a flash resulted in her eyes appearing white instead of what we know as red eye. That resonated with Robin, who then went back and looked at pictures of Bella. In every picture taken of Bella from the age of one on, her right eye looked white.

Her pediatrician told them it was nothing to worry about, which could not have been more wrong.

One of her prosthetic eyes is a soccer ball, paying tribute to her favorite sport in which she dominates. She had been told she would not be a good fit for playing this sport due to the loss of vision on her right side. But she is proving that she can't be stopped.

Her soccer ball eye creates conversations that change lives by bringing awareness to this disease. At just 11 years old, Bella is writing her first book! She hopes to help other children who will go through the same process and feelings. Bella is making her mark in this world, and we are so proud to be a part of it!

Look for more about her children's book in 2024 which will be illustrated by her brother Leo (more about him and Bella's other siblings coming soon). Proceeds of book sales will benefit St. Jude's Research Hospital.

been fatal if it had not been replaced, she had to endure the five phases of treatment to make sure all the leukemia cells had been eradicated. This took two and a half years.

Throughout her diagnosis and treatments, she also had to deal with isolation from her classmates and peers and their lack of understanding and empathy, an unfortunate common thread within the cancer community.

Carolyn wrote her first book detailing her journey with cancer and the many paths life can take you on. Her faith in God, which is first and foremost in her life, has had an immense impact on

arolyn is a soon to be 30-year leukemia survivor!

In November of 1993, an 8th grade basketball accident would ultimately reveal her cancer diagnosis. She was kneed in the back which caused her pain. Her original X-rays indicated things were normal, but, she would end up having to quit the basketball team due to the pain getting progressively worse. When the pain was not subsiding for months, she was eventually diagnosed with acute lymphocytic leukemia.

"I was literally diagnosed in the 9th hour. My bone marrow was 99 plus percent leukemia cells. This was five days before my 14th birthday," Carolyn said, "My diagnosis will always be a celebration of life".

Among other trials and tribulations, including an arterial issue with her broviac catheter that would have



Recipe:

No Bake Cookies

INGREDIENTS

1/2 CUP (OR STICK) OF BUTTER

1/2 CUP MILK

1/2 CUP MILK

instructions/

- Put some parchment paper on a cookie sheet
- Combine the butter, milk, sugars, and cocoa powder in a saucepan and put the heat on low
- Stir everything til the butter is melted
- Slowly increase the heat while you stir and get it to a boil for about a minute
- Remove the saucepan from the stove and keep stirring
- Add the peanut butter or almond butter and vanilla and stir til everything is mixed well
- Add the oats and stir
- Now you can create little bite-sized balls and lay them on the cookie sheet to cool down
- Once they are cooled down, pour yourself a glass of milk or lemonade and enjoy your yummy treat


