





Description:

Diagnosed with stage four, highly aggressive, completely incurable blood cancer that metastasized to his bones, Bill Crews was in for the fight of his life. An avid athlete, he was in great shape. He had spent a lifetime swimming competitively, playing soccer, bull riding and weightlifting. He had been looking forward to a new sport - triathlon. Three weeks following his 37th birthday, he lost use of his arm. Within days, he went from being a triathlete-in-training, to a cancer patient knocking on death's door.

This story, written from the perspective of both a caregiver and patient, gives a glimpse into the cancer journey of a young, athletic family. When cancer strikes, it changes lives forever. For Bill, his 33-year-old wife, and his children who were ages five and three, they learned to wage war together. In the beginning, they defended themselves against this great enemy. Later, they waged war against cancer and they continue to fight today.

Our Daddy's Cancer by Morgan Crews and Dylan Crews was originally published in 2007 by another publisher. It was re-released in 2021 with updated artwork by illustrator Morgan Crews. It is based on two children's experience with their dad's cancer diagnosis at ages 3 and 5.


Chemo Dates is a tiny booklet that offers fun and creative ways to stay romantic when your spouse has cancer.






Description:






Description:








Description:






Description:

This unique look into teen cancer shares the perspectives of both a mom and her teenage son as he battles leukemia. The book also offers many tips and advice for patients and family members.








Description:








Description:


Description:

The companion coloring and activity book is called "I Love My Pets"








Description:



This little book explains how to write a complete sentence. From beginning with a subject and a predicate, more sentence parts get added such as direct objects, adverbs, and verbs.








Description:






Description:






Description:
